


Newborn delivered from COVID-19 positive or suspected mother (treated as Person Under Investigation (PUI))

Home birth - start here



Designate limited set of caregivers


Bathe infant as soon as reasonably possible after birth

Consult social work for post discharge planning

**If breastfeeding,**

Feed infant with expressed breast milk by designated caregivers. Non-maternal parent (or 2<sup>nd</sup> banded person) may assist with feeding. (See visitation section for guidelines for non-maternal parent (or 2<sup>nd</sup> banded person) care).

## Lab Testing



## Visitation

No visitation until newborn infection status determined – **except for** the non-maternal parent (or 2<sup>nd</sup> banded person) may visit and help care for the infant if they are **asymptomatic** (even if they are being monitored due to exposure to the mother). The non-maternal parent (or 2<sup>nd</sup> banded person) will use Contact and Droplet precautions; eye protection; with standard surgical masks while visiting.

Mother **will not** be allowed to visit the infant until she meets CDC recommendations for suspending precautions: resolution of fever without antipyretics, improvement in illness signs and symptoms, negative molecular assay results for COVID-19 from two consecutive sets of tests.

## Discharge

Infant will be eligible for discharge when the infection status is determined and the infant is medically-appropriate for newborn hosp discharge

Infants infected with COVID-19, but asymptomatic, may be discharged home with appropriate precautions and plans for outpt follow-up on a case-by-case basis

Infants who tested negative will be discharged home when medically appropriate to a designated healthy caregiver who is not under observation for COVID-19 risk. If caregiver not available, it will be managed on case-by-case basis. Social work should be involved as outlined above.
